

Workshops

Child care providers and parents are welcome to attend workshops unless specifically noted “for care providers only”. We accept credit card, cash or cheque. Workshops are on a first paid first served basis. You can phone to check if there is space available but we will not hold a space for you until payment is received. If you mail your payment and the workshop is full before your payment was been received we will call you.

Workshops are Non-Refundable

- Please note your workshop date, time and location on your personal calendar as the CCRR Program does not phone to remind participants of workshops.
- Individuals arriving late or leaving early will have their certificates adjusted. No certificates will be issued to individuals who miss 20 minutes or more of a workshop. Please advise staff member before the night of the workshop.
- All **non-members** will pay a straight **\$35.00 fee** to attend workshops/networking provided by the CCRR Program with the exception of the Child Safe First Aid and community facilitated or partnered workshops. Costs for these will be individually listed.
- Sorry, we are unable to accommodate children during workshop sessions.
- The doors will be unlocked 15 minutes before the training begins. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.
- You must contact Childhood Connections within 24 hours if you are unable to attend a workshop. If you do not give this notice, you will be invoiced \$20.00 to be paid before you can sign up for other workshops.
