HRVY

Launched at The Strong Roots Centre on September 1, 2024, HRVY Services has already supported 28 youth and their families in accessing vital wrap-around services. HRVY Services is delivered in partnership with School District 23 and the City of Kelowna. Building on the their existing programming and key research that informed the shift in services, this collaborative model strengthens our ability to support youth and families with evidence-based, community-driven solutions.

Our core supports include:

- Personalized 1:1 youth worker matching
- Individual and family preservation counselling
- Food security assistance
- Pro-social recreational and skill-building activities

Impact Highlights

Youth participating in HRVY Services have reported meaningful improvements:

- 88% feel more confident in themselves
- 75% experienced improved peer relationships
- 88% demonstrated improved school attendance
- 100% feel a true sense of belonging at Strong Roots



Family Resource Program

Our Family Resource Program reached over 7,300 individuals through our events, programming, community kitchen, and classes.

From 2024–2025, the program achieved the following:

- 80% of programs were barrier-free and open to the public.
- 90% of participants reported a stronger sense of community and increased confidence to attend other events and programs.
- We successfully expanded five new programs in the community, supporting families, children, and youth.






Drop-in Childcare Program

Our Drop-in Childcare Program continues to provide a safe, nurturing, and engaging environment for children from 18 months to 5 years old, supporting families across our community.

In the past year from 2024-2025 the program has:

- Welcomed 110 new children, offering flexible care options for families
- Drop-In Childcare Centre won Gold for Best of Kelowna "Best Daycare 2024"
- Partnered with Strong Pilates to allow community members to have reliable childcare option for their children while they participate in a Pilates class





Childminding Program

Childminding continues to provide safe, supportive and flexible care for children ages 0 to 12 years old, allowing parents to participate fully in community programs, workshops, meetings and events.

This past year from 2024-2025, our childminding team has provided over 115 hours of care to children while families participate in various workshops and training events. Whether it was on-site at our location or elsewhere our team prepared and set up age-appropriate activities and crafts to engage with the children.
